

Southampton Vincents Walk – Woolston – Rally Site Netley

Buses leave Vincents Walk at 1000, 1100, 1200, 1300, 1400 and last bus at 1500

Buses will leave the Rally Site at 1030, 1130, 1230, 1330, 1430, 1530, 1630 & 1730





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MB90 began service life at Amersham in November 1968 and she also worked out of High Wycome, Hemel Hempstead and Leatherhead; however her time with London Transport/ London Country lasted barely 10 years. She then passed through various other owners/operators finally acting as a dining facility vehicle with Location Facilities at Feltham.

She was rescued for Preservation in 1990 by Chris Sullivan who returned the vehicle to its original B45D configuration and re-instated.

HFG 923V Leyland National 2 1980

New to SMS as fleet number 123 in June 1980 in NBC unrelieved leaft green livery. Repainted into Southdown traditional green and cream livery in December 1987 and to Stagecoach livery by October 1991. Repainted back into Southdown green and cream livery by March 2000.

D41 MAG Iveco /Robin Hood 1987

New to East Yorkshire MS before passing to Devian Coaches of Enfield. Acquired by present owner in July 2000. Restoration is ongoing

ORV 989 Leyland PD2/40 1958

Entered service with Portsmouth Corporation on 1st February 1958. Stayed in service until 1972 when converted to Driver Training Unit until 1978.

Transferred to Portsmouth City Museums in 2003. Transferred to WOMP (CPPTD)

23 ACD Leyland PD2/37 1962

Originally Brighton Corporation. UKs first one person operated double deck purchased by present owner in 1991 Entered by Duncan Richardson, Alresford



KOW 910F AEC Regent V 1967

From the Southampton Corporation fleet as 402 was the last open platform bus in service in the city in 1981.

Extensive restoration work carried out by present owner once completed will be painted into her delivered livery.

BTR361B AEC Regent V 1964

From the Southampton Corporation fleet as 361 operated in the city from 1964 to 1979. Again as like 402 the present owners have completed extensive restoration work. Entered by Charnie Holden, Southampton



BUF 279C Leyland PD3 1965

From the Southdown MS fleet 279 operated in most of the provincial towns on the south coast. Purchased by present owner in 1997.

UEL 564J Bristol RE 1971

Former Hants and Dorset RE has been acquired this year by present owner to form a small collection of former H&D buses.

5677 EL Bristol Lodekka

ECG 112K Bristol RELL6G 1972

Withdrawn in 1984 after 12 years in service.
Passed to Royal Marines Volunteer cadet corps
then acquired for preservation in 1995 by Terry Lawson.
Donated to Provincial Society in 2020



KOW 909F AEC Regent V 1967

This bus was the very last rear entrance bus to be in service in Southampton and operated farewell tours. However in 1987 it came back into service alongside former London Transport Routemasters.

MXX 398 AEC Regal 1953

RF 421 operated from many LT garages finishing at Kingston and sold in 1978. Has had a number of owners and now with current owner.

BFX 666T Bristol VRT 1979

New to Hants and Dorset in 1979 at Pewsey Depot. Transferred to Wilts and Dorset in 1983. Extensively refurbished in 1998 and operated by Damory Coaches on schools services. Repainted back into WD livery in 2008 and retained as a Heritage vehicle.

E701EFG Scania East Lancs 1988

One of a batch of 10 new in 1980. The first new buses purchased after privatisation and saw further service after B&H with Maynes of Manchester and PC Coaches, Lincoln.

J552 GCD Dennis Dart 1992

New to Stagecoach Coastline in 1992. Spent working in Chichester and Leigh Park. In 2007 sold to Emsworth and District.

RUF 37R Leyland National 1977

New to Southdown in 1977 saw service throughout the Southdown network.

37 was sold to Rennies of Dunfermline then returned south in early 90s when purchased by People Provincial at Gosport. Withdrawn by First in 2005and entered preservation.

UUF 110J Bristol VRT 1971

New to Southdown in 1971. 510 was allocated to Chichester then Portsmouth. It was later transferred to Brighton & Hove for training duties. 510 was later passed to Emblings Coaches and then first acquired for preservation in 2000.

PPM 210G Bristol RESL 1968

One of 12 similar buses new to Brighton, Hove and District in 1968. Remained in Brighton until around 1980 when following refurbishment at Crosville. Entered preservation in 1992.

New to First London, passing to Metroline, London. Sold early 2024 and refurbished to Tomorrows Travel specification.

Established in 2001, The Southampton & District Transport Heritage Trust (S&DTHT) is dedicated to the preservation of former

Southampton buses and other vehicles from around the local area. The Trust look after around 20 vehicles that are important to the history of transport in and around Southampton and provide an opportunity for many to get involved with the preservation and

The oldest vehicle in the collection is a Guy Arab open top bus, which is notably famous with its connection to the 1976 Southampton FA Cup where it was used to carry the team around the city.

The youngest of the collection includes a Leyland Olympian from 1987 and a Dennis Dart from 1995.

Vehicles from our collection attend various events during the year, ranging from the usual bus rally events (with one of the biggest in the country being at Alton on the 3rd Sunday of July), to visits at schools to give pupils an insight into Southampton transport history. Most of our collection is housed at The Brickworks Museum near Southampton which gives us the opportunity to showcase our collection to a greater number of people.

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GET IN TOUCH

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The Friends of King Alfred
Buses, widely known as FoKAB,
is a Winchester-based
charity devoted to preserving
the history of King Alfred
Motor Services (R. Chisnell
& Sons Ltd) which ran the
local bus services in and
around Winchester for almost
fifty years from 1915 to 1973.



We are a group of volunteers and we have been collecting King Alfred buses and coaches for over forty years. We have amassed a collection of sixteen vehicles over that period. They range from an 8-seater minibus to 76-seater double-deckers and the oldest bus dates from 1929, with the most modern built as recently as 1970.

Every year we have a big running day in Winchester on the first Bank Holiday in May when all FoKAB's fleet (along with many other beautifully restored buses) provide a huge range of free bus services around the city – with two other events each year, in September and on New Year's Day. The next opportunity to take free rides on the King Alfred buses is Sunday 15 September.

Last December, one of our rarest buses was involved in a diasterous fire and was very badly damaged. We are now making plans to start the enormous task of reconstructing this

1950 Leyland Olympic HR40.

Today, **FoKAB** will be represented by our 95-year old Leyland Lion, which joined the collection last year, having been fully rebuilt over many years by a team in Scotland.

The Provincial Society was founded in November 2002 to bring together people interested in all aspects of the operation and vehicles of the former Provincial Tramways Company, The Gosport and Fareham Omnibus Company and the Provincial Bus Company, together with all successor and associated companies from 1878 to the present day.

A major aspiration of the Society is to have dedicated premises to allow the further preservation of vehicles and artefacts associated with the above companies.

There is a quarterly magazine Provincial Press.

Membership is open to anyone with a general interest in local transport history.

The City of Portsmouth preserved transport depot (CPPTD) is one of four separate and operationally independent bus preservation projects in Hampshire and West Sussex that are administered by the Working Omnibus Project Limited (WOMP) – the other are the Medstead Depot Omnibus Group, Southampton and District Transport Heritage Trust and the Stedham Garage Group.

Our aim is to conserve and preserve artefacts relating to road passenger transport in Southern England and through our work as an educational charity, to extend this knowledge more widely.

There are currently 20 vehicles looked after in our rented depost at Wicor Farm in Portchester and at East Meon. The latter building is not suitable for members of the public to visit but we plan to hold open days at Wicor during the summer months together with a modest programme of free bus services in Portsmouth and Southsea.

Our members include those who do the physical restoration work on the vehicles, drive and conduct, organise visits and tours or look after the grounds at Wicor Farm.

If you are interested in old buses and have any sort of skill, CPPTD could be just your kind of society. Alternatively, if you do not wish, or are unable, to offer physical help, or live to far away, we will be just as pleased to welcome you, and your subscription will be equally as valuable.



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
